


Artist Statement

In my current work I reflect and think about how technology and media has influenced the way we think. Switching between using everyday objects and more classical approaches to sculpture gives me the freedom to create work concerning a broad variety of aspects. I seek to challenge capitalist hegemony and want to inspire conversations on social constructs, cultural evolution, and individual perspectives. My creative process is anchored in research, inquiry, and a commitment to evolving my practice to resonate with contemporary discourse.

One specific point of Interest is in the creation of memory. Since the dawn of rapid industrialization and now globalization our modes of creating collective memories have significantly shifted. Memory constrution in a very personal sense has also changed. We can share, distribute and access information quicker than ever before. This has an impact on how we visualize and conceptualize our lived experiences in our memories. I'm interested in exploring and researching in this area. I want to find shifts in past artistic representations and to explore ways to capture/visualize a possible sense of our current experience
