
Vincent Graf 2020-2022

This portfolio is an attempt at resisting the pressure of putting my experience into a standardized form by playing with its structure and its potential for fiction. Instead of showing pictures of finished works in a final installation setting, I decided to document my work with drawings.


It is supposed to show potential for the future rather than attempting to be a precise record of the past.

The plot of the storyboard revolves around a vampire that wants to become an artist.






Family picture - Bram Stoker's Dracula, 2022 Charcoal and Graphite on Paper, Epoxy, Steel Nails, 37cm x 37cm

Family picture - Vampyr and Nosferatu, 2022 Charcoal and Graphite on Paper, Epoxy, Steel Nails, 37cm x 37cm



The drawings were mashups of old pictures of mine showing people holding me as a baby and scenes taken from famous vampire movies.


The movies I took the source material from are Bram Stoker's Dracula (1992), Interview with the Vampire (1994), Vampyr (1932) and Nosferatu (1922).

The exhibition was postponed.




A confession, 2022 donkey plushie, Iphone




Am I the Hunter or the Prey?, 2022 Plastic clothes in my size, audio-loop (7'23")





I tried to livestream everything my phone's two cameras see with the help of two micro cameras I attached to it and a portable Wifi-router. The livestream was supposed to be accessible on a website and in an exhibition as two projections on two walls facing each other. I wanted to use the livestream as a stage or a documentation-medium for performative interventions of myself. The staged scenes would seamlessly merge with my everyday life.




I think the idea for this work started to form during a session of a reading group I was part of for a year. We met every week and spent a beautiful time together. For me it felt like this reading group was much more productive than my lonely studio practice and I was hoping to bring this experience into my artistic practice. The livestream was supposed to let me make work in a more spontaneous and possibly collaborative way outside of my studio.









Two video-loops consisting of images found on Google. One is made from depictions of human bodies and the other of images of centipedes. With the help of Google's Similar Image Search I made fluent animations out of the succession of images. Later on I tried to automatize this process of image selection with the help of programming but it never really worked.
