





Pink Solution, 2020 yarn and paper on canvas 40x40 cm



She will take care of it, 2022 bristol paper, everyday objects each 21x29.7 cm








Left Untitled, 2020 wool and acrylic on raw linen 120x90 cm








139 Stiches, 2019 threads and paper on canvas 40x40 cm





Solving A Mystery, 2019 threads and paper on canvas 40x40 cm






Mapping, 2019 threads and paper on canvas 40x40 cm




Minimal Miniatures, 2019 threads and paper each 12x19 cm






















Tiles, 2019 concrete, textiles, threads, hair, plastic, paper each 20x20 cm



















ARTIST STATEMENT

Many objects around us go unnoticed. We don't give them special attention or importance, like many things that happen in life and that remain unmentioned, unseen and disregarded, even though they surely are meaningful and have value.

The materials I work with are not of great value and are mostly taken from everyday life. Some of them I inherited or found, and some are just trash. I find in them a certain attraction, a story, memory, or beauty. They serve as my pallet of colors. By interacting with each other, they form new constellations and synthesis. While rearranging, choosing, and adjusting them, patterns and rules can emerge. Often, I try to find a reaction or an answer to one object I started with. Other times a created problem has to be resolved.

The use of thread has its emotional reasons, as it started with boxes full of threads that I inherited from my grandmother who was a tailor. This medium fascinates me in its structure and the way it limits me (it is a limited pencil).

I always had the feeling that I must use existing materials in order to create something new. I sometimes feel that there is nothing new to invent, you just have to look around precisely in order to notice the unnoticed.

By using the inner side of an envelope or some random sample papers with holes, I want to ask: Did you notice? Have you ever noticed? Did you leave something/someone out?

I often ask myself whether our attention goes to the right things in life. What do we decide to highlight? What do we miss? Is there not a whole section of things, people, happenings that we disregard? That could have had a greater importance and be more valued? that stay unseen and unnoticed?
